Opt-outs: who and why?

We don't know for sure. More data, please! 🛞

• Possible reasons:

- O confusion over opt-out question*
- O unsure if already registered*
- O religious or political objections to voting
- O busy/distracted

O Context:

O 27% of CA are immigrants; >5 million noncitizens – Source: PPIC, 2023
O CA DMV has issued over 2 million new or updated AB 60 license – Source: DMV, 2023

O 10% of drivers don't have a license – source: AAA, 2019
O Big overlap with underrepresented voter population

Reducing accidental opt-outs at DMV

Improve readability of forms – COMING SOON!
Show voters their current registration status during DMV transaction

Expanding AVR & closing the gap

O CoveredCA & Medi-Cal: the next big thing for AVR!

• **Known source** for reaching underrepresented voters:

• Medi-Cal covers >13 million Californians, or 1 in 3

- Applicants are lower-income and racially diverse
- Medi-Cal covers 1/3 of Latinx & Black Californians; 2/3 of CoveredCA enrollees are BIPOC

• Sources: CA Health Care Foundation, 2021; CoveredCA, 2023

- O States that have adopted AVR models like the CA DMV* at their health exchanges have seen huge success!
 - Massachusetts increased registration through social services agencies by >500% after implementing AVR at MassHealth
 - *ACA and Medicare privacy laws require front-end consent before sharing voter reg data
